Dear Friends,

Pentecost is the promise that God is with us all the time, that the Holy Spirit gives life and strength day by day. Often the Spirit is pictured as a dove, a bird of peace, surrounded by the freedom of the air, breeze and sunshine. Long ago, in the Celtic church in northern Britain, there were not many doves around, but plenty of geese, and thereabouts, the goose in flight became a symbol of the Holy Spirit. Geese, when they fly together, are a model of co-operation. They take it in turns to lead the familiar formation of a v-shape, with one at the front. But the leader keeps swapping, so that no one individual gets exhausted as they take it in turns to set the pace. Also, the geese flying to right and left in the formation are helped by the slip stream from the geese in front. Many churches are opening up again at Pentecost, and there is a purpose to our journey. Geese fly towards a goal, and they fly together. There is the old saying that the journey is just as important as the destination. Faith gives us meaning and purpose and draws us together. Often we may want to go it alone, but together we are stronger. If pandemic has taught us something, perhaps this is one of the significant lessons, that the love of God is where life makes most sense.

Even strangers from outside of Jerusalem heard them enthuse in a language they could understand - their own language. Would that we could do the same.
