Dear Friends,

Easter is at the heart of Christian hope. The story of resurrection, of new life, holds the promise that this new life is for all. The evils of the world, poverty, sickness, war, loneliness, ignorance, greed, cruelty, can make

life seem that it has no meaning or purpose. The writer of the Letter to Hebrews makes the point that God is not far away or uninvolved with the hurt and mess of human life:

Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin.
